Barron Park Students Vote For President Of The United States

As the entire nation anxiously watches the ongoing presidential race, millions of elementary school students all around the country, were able to cast a vote a week early for the next U.S. president.

Every Kid Votes, a nation-wide mock election program among elementary school students, took place on Tuesday, November 1st, at thousands of participating schools through out the country.

During the last Every Kid Votes event in 2014, over 6 million students participated in the vote, which accurately predicted the next president.

The mock election program was organized by American Legacy Publishing—the publishers of Studies Weekly Publications. Studies Weekly publications specialize in social studies and science curriculum for grades K-6 in all 50 states.

“The main purpose of education is to produce a self-governing citizenry,” said Ed Rickers, president of Studies Weekly. “This is meaningful civic activity for our students to practice informed voting—the most basic and essential act of citizenry, and now we are inviting all elementary schools nationwide to participate.”

Students were given a choice of four candidates, Green, Libertarian, Republican and Democratic parties.

The online election materials we had access to included information about candidates from the Democratic, Republican, Libertarian and Green parties. The online student and teacher materials list many additional resources (both books and websites) for learning more about political parties.

The results for the country were not ready at the time I wrote this newsletter, but our school results were as follows.

Parent/Teacher Conferences

Parent/teacher conferences have begun and may continue through December. Please make it a priority to attend your child's conference to get informed about how your child is progressing this year.

What Should You Expect At Your Parent-Teacher Conference?

- The teacher will review your child's strengths and areas for continuing development.
- Samples of your child's work and the results of various assessments will be shared.
- The teacher may refer to the progress report and indicate your child's progress to ward meeting the standards that we expect students to achieve by the end of the school year. Is s/he making expected progress? Is s/he making limited progress? If so, is there a need to put increased attention on a particular skill or concept? Has s/he already met or exceeded the standard?
- Conference topics will include academic growth and performance, as well as study skills and social/emotional development.
- The teacher may suggest ways in which you can assist and support your child's progress at home.
- The teacher will give you an opportunity to ask questions and share reflections about your child's growth and achievement.

It is our common goal, as parents and teachers, to work together in the best interest of all our children.
